## Part B - ENTRY CONDITIONS

### B1 PROFICIENCY

NB: This section is to be read with SLSA Policy number 5.4 Patrol Hour Requirements 2004. (This policy is currently under review and will be made available for viewing soon).

- (a) All members entered for these State Championships will have to undertake the SLSA Proficiency Test by 31 December 2009.  
(Under 15 competitors are NOT exempt from these proficiency requirements).

Any member who completes a proficiency test after 31st December 2009 will not be eligible to compete in these Championships, unless authorised by the Chief Executive Officer. The Chief Executive Officer has the discretion to grant competition eligibility in cases, which are considered to be of exceptional circumstances. The discretion will only allow a proficiency examination after that date but only up to January 26 of the year in which the championships fall, after which no late proficiency will be approved for the purpose of entry into these Championships under any circumstance.

Those members gaining their Bronze Medallion in the period from 30<sup>th</sup> June 2009 to 31<sup>st</sup> December 2009 will be considered as satisfying the proficiency requirements for entry.

- (b) To compete in the Open March Past event, members must have fulfilled SLSA requirements in regards to membership status and comply with one of the following requirements:
- (i) Be proficient Surf Rescue Certificate Awardees with CPR endorsement if over the age of 15 as at 30 September each season
  - (ii) Hold a Resuscitation Award CPR endorsed
  - (iii) Have fulfilled the resuscitation requirements of the Bronze Medallion proficiency

Further to this, members wishing to compete in the Open March Past event must fulfil their patrol hour obligations relevant to their membership status and the award to which they are qualified.

To compete in the Under 23 March Past competitors may be a U/15, U/17 or U/19 year old members who are proficient award holding members relative to their age category.

To compete in the Under 17 March Past competitors may be a U/15 or U/17 year old members who are proficient award holding members relative to their age category.

- (c) It is essential all Club Competition Officers endorsing the entries ensure the correctness of the current proficiency details included, and where required, submit proficiency and/ or examination documentation with their entries.
- (d) Notwithstanding the foregoing, SLSWA reserves the right to conduct a random detailed proficiency check of entries, and under such circumstances, the selected clubs will be required to submit appropriate documentation to substantiate the current proficiency or qualification status of those members entered. The proficiency documents shall also be marked clearly to highlight the competitors names listed on the entry forms.
- (e) Those members gaining their Surf Rescue Certificate or Bronze Medallion in the period from October 1 of the preceding year of the championships to the closing date of entries - will be considered as satisfying the proficiency requirements for entry to these Championships.
- (f) All surf boat sweeps must have undertaken, through State Centre, the course in surf boat sweeping and obtained their level one coaching accreditation as a minimum requirement to participate in the Australian Surf Life Saving Championships. This minimum standard will be applied for these Championships. A list of accredited surf boat sweeps will be obtained from State Centre for use by the championship officials.

## B2 PATROL REQUIREMENTS FOR COMPETITORS

All members who wish to compete at any SLSWA competition must be financial, proficient and carry out patrol duties.

- (a) For all Active members and any other categories of membership not mentioned, the minimum number of personal patrol hours required for the period of 1st January to 31st December of the year preceding the championships shall be:

<b>U15 and Active members</b>	<b>16 hours</b>
<b>Active Reserve</b>	<b>8 hours</b>
<b>Long Service and Life Members</b>	<b>Exempt</b>

Patrol hours requirements for March Past only competitors shall be in accordance with their respective membership category.

- (b) Patrol Hours shall only be calculated on the following personal patrol hours completed by the competitor:
- (i) Rostered
  - (ii) Substitute for other members (These hours will be credited to the member who is actually doing the patrol – NOT the member for whom the substitution is being done).
  - (iii) Voluntary patrols
  - (iv) Water Safety for Junior Activities
  - (v) Specialist Services: Radio Command (VN6SA)
  - (vi) Examiner
  - (vii) Training Officer

Subject to the approval of the club, lifesaving and education roles listed in points (iv) to (vii) may also be used to accumulate hours to that of patrolling. All hours should be appropriately logged or recorded. In addition, if Clubs have in their respective Constitutions a regulation that members who hold various committee positions or undergo other activities in lieu of patrolling, a letter addressed to the Chief Executive Officer outlining exemption details of these members must be submitted with entries.

- (c) Members with less than the foregoing prescribed patrol hours, without suitable approval, are ineligible to compete at these Championships and will not be entered.

### (i) NEW MEMBERS AND FORMER MEMBERS REJOINING

- (d) New members (calculated from when they complete their relevant award) and former members rejoining during the period 1<sup>st</sup> January 2009 to 31<sup>st</sup> December 2009 are required to complete patrol hours in accordance with the following table:

NOTE I: Former members are defined as those who have rejoined after previous membership has lapsed. (Eg members who were not proficient and financial for the 2008/09 season)

NOTE II: New members joining after 1<sup>st</sup> January 2010 must obtain their respective award, fulfil new member requirements (patrol hours) which have been set at a minimum of four (4) hours prior to the close of entries.

NOTE III: Members rejoining after 1<sup>st</sup> January 2010 must obtain their proficiency by the 26<sup>th</sup> January, fulfil new member requirements (patrol hours) which have been set at a minimum of four (4) hours prior to the close of entries.

**(ii) SRC**

Members completing their SRC after 1<sup>st</sup> January 2010 must have completed their award, fulfil new member requirements (patrol hours) which have been set at a minimum of four (4) hours prior to the close of entries.

**B3 SPONSOR IDENTIFICATION**

It is also a condition of entry to the Championships that competitors may be required to carry sponsors logos/ identification on craft, boats and equipment. However, if this occurs every effort will be made not to cover other signage, provided it does not conflict with the naming right sponsor of the Championships. For further information on sponsorship, refer to SLSA Competition Sponsorship Policy, accessible on the SLSA website.

**B4 RESTRICTIONS & PROVISOS**

- (a) All events shall be contested by teams and individuals representing clubs.
- (b) All team entry sheets will be required to be lodged with the Marshall. Any withdrawal or replacement of a competitor or team shall be notified in writing to the Marshall by the representative of the Club.

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**PART C: ENTRIES**

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**C1 ENTRY CLOSURE**

- (a) By entering using the online entry system the club declares that the proficiency and patrol hour aspects of all competitors on the entry forms are in accordance with the requirements of their membership categories.
- (b) Any entries received after the closing date will be considered as late entries.

**C2 LATE ENTRIES**

- (a) Late entries will not be accepted after 5pm on the 25<sup>th</sup> February 2010.
- (b) Late entries will be charged the normal entry fee plus the late entry fee of \$35.00 per competitor. The Club will be invoiced accordingly.
- (c) **Late entries of new members gaining their respective awards after the closing date of entries will not be accepted.**

**C3 ENTRIES**

- (a) Entries must be registered with SLSWA by close of entries listing all competitors, including the 'Handlers only'. Handlers are required to be a current financial member of the Club, as outlined in the SLSA Surf Sports Manual 33<sup>rd</sup> Edition 8.2.1 (c).
- (b) Membership Classifications
  - Open – O
  - Under 19 – U19
  - Under 17 – U17
  - Under 15 – U15
- (c) Each competitor entered must have completed a proficiency test and this must be detailed in the entries.

**C4 ENTRY FEES**

- (a) The cost per competitor entered in these Championships is \$35.00 each, irrespective of the number of events entered.
- (b) There is no cost for handlers only entered in these Championships.
- (c) Clubs will be invoiced accordingly for entry fees.
- (d) Entry fees are non-refundable if members do not take part in these Championships or if events are subsequently cancelled after commencement of the Championships.
- (e) All prices outlined in this Bulletin include GST.

**C5 DECLARATION**

- (a) It is a condition of entries that by using the online entry system that clubs declare that the competitors entered are financial, proficient and satisfy the patrol requirements as detailed in this document, and the entries are in all other ways in accordance with Association and Club regulations.

## **C6 COMPETITION CONDITIONS**

- (a) Competition conditions for all events not expressed in this Bulletin are set out in the 33<sup>rd</sup> Edition SLSA Competition Manual and any subsequent Bulletins.
- (b) The conditions for the 6 Person and 5 Person R&R events are detailed in the 28th Edition of the Rescue and Resuscitation Competition Manual (November, 1998) and any subsequent amendments.

## **C7 PENALTIES – BREACH OF ENTRY REGULATIONS**

It is mandatory that ALL competitors are listed in the Club's entry.

Entry of competitors who are ineligible due to non qualification or proficiency, default of personal patrol hour obligations, or other breach of association or club entry regulations have penalties provided for as follows:

THE PENALTY FOR BREACH OF ENTRY REGULATIONS FOR THE 2010 WA SURF LIFE SAVING CHAMPIONSHIPS WILL BE THE AUTOMATIC REJECTION OF ENTRIES FOR THOSE PERSONS FOUND TO BE IN BREACH OF REGULATIONS AND THE FORFEITURE OF THEIR ENTRY FEES.

APPLICATION OF THE AUTOMATIC PENALTY WILL NOT PRECLUDE FURTHER DISCIPLINARY ACTION BY THE ASSOCIATION AGAINST CLUBS OR OTHER PERSONS IF DEEMED APPROPRIATE IN THE CASE OF SERIOUS ATTEMPTS TO DEFEAT ASSOCIATION REGULATIONS.

### **D2 CARNIVAL SAFETY**

As implemented at the Australian Surf Lifesaving Championships, clubs wishing to enter the 2010 WA Surf Lifesaving Championships **must** supply power craft operators on a 'pro-rata' scale, based upon the number of competitors entered per club. Clubs must also supply First Aid personal.

Accordingly, the following schedule (schedule B) sets out the IRB prerequisite obligations that clubs must fulfil for the duration of the Championships in order to ensure that their competitor entries are accepted for the Championships.

#### Clubs

Will be required to supply a minimum of one IRB crewmen at each allotted water safety time slot.

Water Safety for the Championships is ultimately the responsibility of the Carnival Committee. An IRB water safety roster (Appendix B) is attached. **Clubs not fulfilling their requirements will be withdrawn from the all events until they meet their obligations.**

First Aid for the Championships is ultimately the responsibility of the Carnival Committee. A first aid roster (Appendix B) is attached. **Clubs not fulfilling their requirements will be withdrawn from the all events until they meet their obligations.**

#### **D3 OVERSEAS/ INTERSTATE COMPETITORS**

Competitors from overseas/ interstate Clubs wanting to compete in these Championships must apply to the Chief Executive Officer to do. For consideration competitors must be affiliated with International Life Saving (ILS) to participate in the 2010 Championships, however international or interstate competitors are not eligible for points or medals.

If these competitors finish in a medal or point scoring position, the next placed 'local' competitor will be awarded the medal and points for that event.

#### **D4 PROTESTS**

All protests shall be lodged with the appropriate carnival official in accordance with the procedures set down in the 33<sup>rd</sup> Edition SLSA Surf Sports Manual, and shall identify the specific sections/ clauses in the Competition Manual upon which the protest is based.

All protests must be submitted on the correct form. A copy of the form can be found in the back of the Surf Sports Manual.

A fee of \$220.00 will be charged to lodge a protest or appeal with the Appeals Committee. Should the protest or appeal be successful the fee will be refunded.

#### **D5 TEAM ENTRIES AND CHANGES**

The composition of teams will be taken as they are entered. Please ensure that Team Manager's have a copy of their entries. If there is any entry dispute the Manager will not need to provide these as evidence.

If the composition of a team is different from that entered then a new team sheet will need to be presented at marshalling. Subsequent changes are allowable as per the rules and must be accompanied by a new team sheet. Any alterations or changes to teams will require a new team entry sheet to be lodged with the Marshall prior to the new team being permitted to start in the next round. Change of Team sheets are attached (Appendix C).

#### **D6 REPLACEMENT OF GEAR – BOAT AND CRAFT EVENTS**

Sections 6.4.2(h), 6.5.3(h) and 5.2.4(c) of the 33<sup>rd</sup> Edition of SLSA Surf Sports Manual refers to the replacement of gear including boats, oars, skis, paddles, boards or other equipment during a race.

Competitors are reminded that if replacement gear is to be utilised, it is the responsibility of the competitor/ team/ crew to ensure that any damaged equipment left in the competition arena does not impede the progress of another competitor/ team/ crew involved in the race.

Any equipment utilised as replacement gear is subject to scrutineering.

#### **D7 PRESENTATION OF MEDALLIONS/ TROPHIES**

Championship medallions in gold, silver and bronze will be awarded to the first three (3) individual/ team place getters in each event.

Team Managers must ensure that where a competitor is required for a medal presentation and need to be in the competition arena for another event, that they inform the relevant section arena marshal so that the event can be delayed while the presentation takes place, otherwise the event will go ahead without the competitor.

COMPETITORS NOTE: Your stand-in must remain until you return to the competition arena

**Competitors will not be permitted to receive their medal unless appropriately dressed. Competitors must present themselves with Club Competition Cap and costumes only, however Club and sponsor t-shirts and rash vests are permitted for sun protection.**

Every attempt will be made to ensure presentations of medals are conducted as efficiently as possible, so please ensure you are appropriately dressed and present yourself for presentation immediately concluding your event.

**Some events also include the Gold medallists receiving a trophy. These trophies will be presented to gold medallists during the medal presentation. Once presented, these remain the responsibility of the winning individual/ team/ Club until they are called for return by SLSWA.**

**The presentations for the State Trophies and Surf Champions Banner will take place at the conclusion of the last event. The Bernie Kelly Medal will be announced at the conclusion of the Championships.**

A full copy of the State Championship results will be available on the web, [www.mybeach.com.au](http://www.mybeach.com.au), on the Tuesday after the Championships completion.

#### **D8 MISCONDUCT**

Misconduct before, during and after the Championships, including tampering with signs, fences or PA system equipment will not be tolerated. Offending members risk disciplinary action.

Consumption of alcohol is only permitted in the designated areas; however it is not permitted within the competition or marshalling areas. Competitors and club supporters drinking in these areas will render their club liable to disqualification and further disciplinary action.

A Carnival Disciplinary Committee has been appointed with powers to 'cite' or take whatever action necessary as a result of misconduct.

#### **D9 THEFT**

Any person/ s found stealing signage or any equipment owned by Surf Life Saving WA or associated sponsors will be immediately reported to the local Police and that person/ s will be brought before the SLSWA Judiciary Committee.

NOTE: Automatic disqualification from all Championship events will occur if any member is found guilty of theft.

#### **D10 BEACH LAYOUT & ACCESS**

Every effort will be made at these Championships to provide for a fair arena for all competitors and teams. If conditions are deemed unfair the Carnival Committee may relocate the arena. The Championships beach layout will be posted on [www.mybeach.com.au](http://www.mybeach.com.au) from Monday 11<sup>th</sup> January 2010.

##### ACCESS TO BEACH

No unauthorised vehicles will be permitted on Secret Harbour beach under City of Rockingham regulations.

##### ACCESS TO COMPETITION ARENA

The only people permitted in the competition arena are:

- (a) Active Competition Officials
- (b) Active competitors (those in the marshalling area or in events)
- (c) Competitor stand-ins (these people must be wearing the competitors club cap in the marshalling area and competition arena for identification)

The Referee or Sectional Referee has the right to evict any person/ s from the arena if the above access requirements are breached. Any person/ s that breach the above access requirement may be subject to disciplinary action.

### SURF BOAT ACCESS

No surfboat trailers will be permitted on the beach. Clubs will be required to carry all boats onto the beach. A parking area for club trailers will be created.

#### **D11 PARKING**

Parking is as per the City of Rockingham's regulations.

NOTE: The City of Rockingham will be enforcing the parking restrictions throughout the weekend. Please abide by all regulations.

#### **D12 GEAR TRAILERS AND CRAFT STORAGE**

Gear Trailers are not permitted on the beach. Trailers can be parked on the grassed area to the south of the club house. No cars are permitted to be left in these areas. Surf craft are to be stored on the grassed area behind the competition arena with gear trailers. No surf craft is permitted to be left unattended on the beach. Gear trailers will only be provided access onto the grassed reserve from 4:00pm Friday 26<sup>th</sup> February 2010.

Note: No responsibility will be taken for craft left unattended.

#### **D13 SECURITY**

There will be limited security on Friday and Saturday. No responsibility will be taken for damaged gear left unattended.

#### **D14 CLUB TENTS AND SPECTATOR VIEWING**

Clubs Tents are to be erected in the designated tent area behind the beach arena (please refer to Championships beach layout). There is no draw for tent positions. Clubs can have as many tents as they require.

Club Tents can be placed and erected at any time **after** 4.00pm on Friday 26<sup>th</sup> February 2010. Club tents will not be allowed in front of the Sound Van or the VIP Tent.

VIP viewing will be clearly marked and have restricted entry.

At no time are any person/ s permitted to use the sand dunes as a viewing area. This is an environmentally protected area.

All spectators and competitors are also requested to utilise all rubbish bins made available, to ensure the beach remains tidy at all times and is left in pristine conditions.

#### **D15 SCRUTINEERING**

All board and skis must be scrutineered prior to racing in any State Title event. Competitors will not be permitted to start in any event unless their equipment carries the current scrutineering sticker.

Please note that at the Australian Titles, all craft will need to be re-scrutineered from the quarter finals.

Two opportunities will be provided for competitors to get their craft scrutineered before the Championships:

- Saturday 6<sup>th</sup> February, Round 4 Premiership Series, Sorrento  
11am – 2.00pm
- Friday 12<sup>th</sup> February City of Perth SLSC – grassed area  
4pm – 7pm

Competitors are encouraged to scrutineer their equipment as early as possible.

#### **D16 MARSHALLING**

There will be NO marshalling calls over the central PA system. Competitors are required to be in the vicinity of each separate marshalling area as relevant when the call for starters is made by the marshal.

#### **D17 EVENT TIME LIMITS**

All water events will be subject to a time limit.

In craft relay, taplin relay and board rescue events, where the winning team is across the finish line, any other teams with members yet to enter the water may be withdrawn from the event.

In board rescue heats, once the first three place getters have been confirmed, any teams still on the water may be directed to paddle to the side of the course and return to the beach.

In ironperson races, once the winner is across the finish line then any other competitor yet to enter the water for the final leg may be withdrawn from the event.

In surf races, a time limit will be announced on the day and any competitor exceeding that limit may be picked up by the duty boat and withdrawn from the event.

#### **D18 JEWELLERY**

The removal of all jewellery and other body adornments will be in accordance with the rules. The arena referee will have absolute authority in ruling on this.

#### **D19 ADMINISTRATION CENTRE**

The administration area will be located in Secret Harbour SLSC.

#### **D20 CLUB MARSHAL'S BRIEFING**

A compulsory meeting for all Club Marshall's will be held on Monday 15<sup>th</sup> February 2010 at the **Scarboro SLSC** at 6pm.

#### **D21 COMPETITION OFFICIALS BRIEFING**

A Competition Officials Briefing will be held **the Scarboro SLSC**, Monday 22<sup>nd</sup> February 2010 at 6pm. This is to confirm Officials' appointments and final program details.

A Competition Officials Briefing will also be held at 6.30am Saturday 27<sup>th</sup> February 2010, in the **Secret Harbour SLSC hall**.

Note: Country competition officials are not required to attend the Monday evening briefing due to travel constraints. Country competition officials will be fully briefed at Saturdays 6.30am briefing.

#### **D22 COMPETITOR IDENTIFICATION**

All competitors must have their team identified clearly. For team events where a club has more than one team in the same heat/ final, teams must be appropriately dressed in different coloured race singlets or numbered competition hats. Distinguishing numbers or letters marked on the upper arm is also permitted.

#### **D23 COMBINED CLUB TEAMS (CCT) POLICY**

For Senior Events, Combined Club Teams will be based on the average of the previous two years Aggregate Point score from the Senior State Championships. Those scoring less than 100 points will be deemed eligible to create combined teams. Those scoring greater than 100 points cannot combine. Nor can they have any of their members participate in a combined team with clubs that are eligible to combine teams.

## **PART E: COMMERCIAL AND OTHER IDENTIFICATION ON 'APPAREL AND EQUIPMENT'**

The Chief Executive Officer or his representative, Championship Referee and Sectional Referees, reserve the right to enforce the following from the SLSA Sponsorship Policy at the 2010 WA Surf Life Saving Championships.

No competitor, handler and/ or Club is permitted to have any sign writing, logos or corporate ID on either clothing, competition apparel, gear, equipment or on the person in the competition arena (including marshalling and presentation areas) which is deemed not in 'good taste'.

At the conclusion of events, place getters may be offered items of apparel (t-shirt etc) identified with the sponsor, which they may be asked to wear during the presentation of medals. Every cooperation is requested in this regard and members should keep in mind that the involvement of sponsor's help to curtail significant expenses that would otherwise need to be passed onto competitors and clubs.

- (a) No competitor shall be required to carry either the carnival naming rights or individual event sponsors identification on lycras, except where specified below (Note 1). Competitors will be required to carry sponsors logos/ identification on craft/ boats/ equipment and body (tattoos) except where specified below (Note 2). Where physically possible, no signage will be covered.

NOTE I: All competitors in Championship events may be asked to wear naming right sponsor's lycra's.

NOTE II: Those craft/ persons with rival sponsors to the carnival/ event naming right sponsor will not be required to display the carnival/ event naming right sponsors signage and/ or to cover the rival sponsor's signage.

- (b) CRAFT & EQUIPMENT

### BOARDS

The front deck of boards will be the event sponsors signage area where a 33cm X 33cm (approx.) decal, etc, may be placed and the remainder of the surface area will be the owners.

### SKIS

The front deck of skis will be the event sponsors signage area where a 33cm X 33cm (approx.) decal, etc, may be placed and the remainder of the surface area will be the owners.

### SURF BOATS

A space 150cm X 30cm above the waterline on both sides of the boat.

If the designated spaces are not available or practical due to existing signage, then the naming rights/ event sponsors signage will be placed on any suitable alternative spaces.

- (c) UNIFORMS

### LYCRA SINGLET/ FULL COSTUMES

A club can display its own sponsor's signage, once only, in a space not exceeding 15cm X 15cm.

### FULL COSTUMES

In this context, means women's costumes or R&R and March Past costumes. Again, a club sponsor may be displayed once only in an area not exceeding 15cm X 15cm.

### MALE COSTUMES

Club sponsors can be shown once only on an area on the costumes not exceeding 15cm X 5cm.

- (d) MARCH PAST BANNERS

Club sponsors can be shown once only on the banner in an area not exceeding 25cm X 25cm.

- (e) BODY TATTOOS

Club sponsors can be shown once only on the body and limbs not exceeding 15cm X 5cm.

### **Caris Bros Trophy – Open, Under 23 and Under 19 Events Total Points**

Presented to the Club with the highest total pointscore for Open, Under 23 and Under 19 Events combined at the 2010 WA Surf Lifesaving Championships.

### **A.D. Scott Cup – Under 19 Total Points**

Presented to the Club with the highest pointscore calculated from Under 19 events at the 2010 WA Surf Lifesaving Championships.

### **Cadet Cup – Under 15 and U 17 Total Points**

Presented to the Club with the highest pointscore calculated from Under 15 and Under 17 events at the 2010 WA Surf Lifesaving Championships.

### **Foundation President's Trophy and R&R Premiers banner**

Presented to the team who wins the Open 6 Person R&R at the 2010 WA Surf Lifesaving Championships.

### **Walsh Shield – Under 19 5 Person R&R**

Presented to the winning team in the Under 19 5 Person R&R at the 2010 WA Surf Lifesaving Championships.

### **Paton Shield – Open March Past**

Presented to the winning team in the Open March Past event at the 2010 WA Surf Lifesaving Championships.

### **Stan Jacks Shield – Handicap March Past**

Presented to the winning team in the U'21 March Past event at the 2010 WA Surf Lifesaving Championships.

### **Bryan Shield – Open Surf Boat**

Presented to the winning crew in the Open Surf Boat Race at the 2010 WA Surf Lifesaving Championships.

### **Julian Trophy – Under 19 Surf Boat**

Presented to the winning crew in the Under 19 Surf Boat Race at the 2010 WA Surf Lifesaving Championships.

### **Senior Champion Lifesaver – Open Male and Female Lifesaver**

Presented to the winners of the Open Male and Female State Champion Lifesaver at the 2010 WA Surf Lifesaving Championships.

### **Junior Champion Lifesaver – Under 19 Male and Female Lifesaver**

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## Combined Club Teams (CCT) Policy

### Aim:

To encourage developing or less competitive clubs to become involved in Surf Sports.

### Policy:

- Competitors from identified clubs will be able to combine with other competitors
- It is only applicable to SLSWA operated events, for Junior, Senior and Country Competition
- Each competitor will represent their own club within their combined team
- Points will be distributed accordingly. For example, in a 4 member team, if each member is from a different club they will each receive 25% of the point's allocation
- The Combined Team must be entered in the event by one club within the CCT
- Competitors can change club combinations between different events but not within the same events. Once a combined team is entered, those clubs will be represented in that team, another club cannot be substituted.
- The priority will always be to form a Club Team rather than a Combined Club Team
- Competitors will compete in their own club competition cap
- This policy will be reviewed at the conclusion of 2010 season
- Combined Club Teams will be permitted in IRB Racing as part of the development process and the criteria below will not apply. Teams must still fall within the overall intention of this policy.
- The Carnival Referee's discretion can be employed if it is deemed that the CCT is not within the intention of this policy

### Procedure:

For senior and junior events, Combined Club Teams will be based on the average of the previous two years Aggregate Point score from each State Championships. Those scoring less than 100 points will be deemed eligible to create combined teams. Those scoring greater than 100 points cannot combine. Nor can they have any of their members participate in a combined team with clubs that are eligible to combine teams.
