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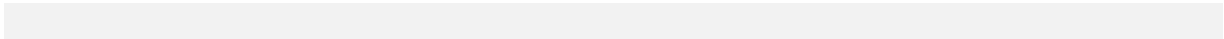

CHECKLIST

3. DECLARATION:

4. READ CAREFULLY:

Penalties – Breach of Entry Regulations

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Part A: EVENTS

These championships will be conducted in accordance with the Rules and Regulations of the SLSA Surf Sports Manual 33rd Edition and subsequent amendments.

For any event to be contested at the WA Surf Life Saving Championships, a minimum of three (3) starters from two (2) separate clubs is required.

QUALIFICATION EVENTS

Only those competitors who are a Country qualifier or who have qualified at the Trigg Qualifying Carnival can enter these events.

Qualifying Carnival Trigg

The following events will be restricted at the 2010 WA Junior Surf Life Saving Championships. Qualifying for these events will be via the Junior Qualifying carnival scheduled for Trigg Island on the Sunday 21st February (8:00am).

The Qualifying Events will be:

- Flags
- Board Rescue
- Board Race
- Beach Sprint

The following qualifying numbers will apply:

*If a country position is not taken by a qualifier then a reserve from the Trigg Island Qualifying Carnival will be offered the position.

Country Qualifying

Country clubs unable to access this carnival will have the ability to nominate through their region.

1. Mid West Broadwater Bay SLSC, Geraldton SLSC, Dongara Denison SLSC
2. Peel Secret Harbour SLSC, Mandurah SLSC, Port Bouvard SLSC
3. South West Busselton SLSC, Binningup SLSC, City of Bunbury SLSC, Dalyellup SLSC, Margaret River SLSC
4. Great Southern Denmark SLSC, Albany SLSC, Esperance-Goldfields SLSC

Regional representatives are only required for the four events nominated in the table above. Country clubs must enter their qualifying representatives directly online at www.mybeach.com.au by the 17th February.

Clubs must work with the other clubs within their region to select their athletes for the State Titles. Regions need to implement a process for selection of their athletes. It is recommended that the Local Area Carnivals and the Country Carnival be the basis for the selection. However, due to the early timing of the 2nd LAC, regions may wish to conduct a separate qualifying carnival. It is up to each region to determine their method of qualifying through consensus amongst the clubs.

Individuals from country regions who have not been selected to represent their region can qualify through the Trigg Carnival on the 21st February.

Individual Events

Where events are contested by individuals it is the individual that will qualify through to the State Championships. Should the individual withdraw the position may be filled by reserves from the qualifying event.

Team Events

Where qualifying events are contested by Teams i.e. Board Rescue it is the Club that will qualify a Team through to the State Championships. The members of that team may change. Country qualifiers in team events cannot qualify additional teams at the Trigg qualifying carnival.

A3 DRAFT PROGRAM OF EVENTS

A Draft Program of events for the qualifying carnival at Trigg Island is available on www.mybeach.com.au.

Part B - ENTRY CONDITIONS

B1 PROFICIENCY

- (a) The specific requirements of the preliminary assessments and proficiency testing are outlined in SLSWA Circular 24-0910.

Please Note: The Junior Participation Skill Evaluation must be completed prior to the Junior Competition Skill Evaluation. This is a risk management issue and both evaluations must be entered onto Surfguard appropriately. This is an insurance requirement of SLSWA.

- (b) Notwithstanding the foregoing, SLSWA reserves the right to conduct a random detailed proficiency check of entries, and under such circumstances, the selected clubs will be required to submit appropriate documentation to substantiate the current proficiency or qualification status of those members entered.

B2 RESTRICTIONS & PROVISOS

- (a) All events shall be contested by teams and individuals representing clubs.
(b) All team entry sheets will be required to be lodged with the Marshall. Any withdrawal or replacement of a competitor or team shall be notified in writing to the Marshall by the representative of the Club.
(c) There is no patrol hour obligation for junior activity members to compete in 2010 WA Junior Surf Lifesaving Championships.

PART C: ENTRIES

C1 ENTRY CLOSURE

- (a) Club entries close at SLSWA on Wednesday 11pm, 3rd March 2010.
(b) Any entries received after the closing date will be considered as late entries.

C2 LATE ENTRIES

- (a) All entries must be entered online. Declarations must be faxed directly to SLSWA.
(b) Late entries will not be accepted after the late entry closure.
(c) Late entries will be charged the normal entry fee plus the late entry fee of \$30.00. The Club will be invoiced accordingly.
(d) Late entries of new members gaining their respective awards after the closing date of entries will not be accepted.

C3 ENTRIES

- (a) Competition Categories
Under 14 – U14
Under 13 – U13
Under 12 – U12
Under 11 – U11
(b) Each competitor entered must have completed their relevant age group competition requirements.

C4 ENTRY FEES

- (a) The cost per competitor entered in these Championships is \$30.00 each, irrespective of the number of events entered.
(b) Clubs will be invoiced accordingly for entry fees.
(c) Entry fees are non-refundable if members do not take part in these Championships or if events are subsequently cancelled after commencement of the Championships.
(d) All prices outlined in this Bulletin include GST.

C5 DECLARATION

It is a condition of entry that a Club Executive Officer must sign the entry declaration certifying all competitors listed on the entry form are financial, proficient and satisfy the patrol requirements as detailed in this document, and the entries are in all other ways in accordance with Association and Club regulations.

C6 COMPETITION CONDITIONS

- (a) Competition conditions for all events not expressed in this Bulletin are set out in the 33rd Edition SLSA Competition Manual and any subsequent Bulletins.
- (b) The conditions for the 2 Person R&R events are detailed in the 28th Edition of the Rescue and Resuscitation Competition Manual (November 1998) and any subsequent Bulletins.

C7 U/10 AGE GROUP COMPETITION

For developmental reasons in WA, Junior Activities members between the Under 11 – Under 14 age groups have only been permitted to compete in WA inter-club carnivals.

In accordance with the above, Junior Activities Members in the Under 10 age group category are permitted to participate in the 2010 WA Junior Surf Lifesaving Championships, in team events only. This is providing requirements outlined in the SLSA Competition Manual 33rd Edition Section 2.3.1 are met.

In other words, for Under 10's to compete in water events, they must have completed the competition skill evaluation for Under 11's.

C8 PENALTIES – BREACH OF ENTRY REGULATIONS

It is mandatory that ALL competitors are listed on the club entry system.

THE PENALTY FOR BREACH OF ENTRY REGULATIONS FOR THE 2010 WA JUNIOR SURF LIFESAVING CHAMPIONSHIPS WILL BE THE AUTOMATIC REJECTION OF ENTRIES FOR THOSE PERSONS FOUND TO BE IN BREACH OF REGULATIONS AND THE FORFEITURE OF THEIR ENTRY FEES.

APPLICATION OF THE AUTOMATIC PENALTY WILL NOT PRECLUDE FURTHER DISCIPLINARY ACTION BY THE ASSOCIATION AGAINST CLUBS OR OTHER PERSONS IF DEEMED APPROPRIATE IN THE CASE OF SERIOUS ATTEMPTS TO DEFEAT ASSOCIATION REGULATIONS.

PART D: EVENT INFORMATION

D1 CARNIVAL COMMITTEE

The following shall form the Carnival Committee, under whose directions shall be placed all matters relating to the actual conduct of the 2010 WA Junior Surf Lifesaving Championships.

The Committee will consult with Sectional Referees as appropriate and will seek advice from other relevant parties on issues as required.

D2 CARNIVAL SAFETY

As implemented at the Australian Surf Lifesaving Championships, clubs wishing to enter the 2010 WA Junior Surf Lifesaving Championships **must** supply power craft operators and craft on a 'pro-rata' scale, based upon the number of competitors entered per club. Clubs must also supply First Aid personal.

Accordingly, the following schedule sets out the IRB prerequisite obligations that clubs must fulfil for the duration of the Championships in order to ensure that their competitor entries are accepted for the Championships.

Clubs

Water Safety for the Championships is ultimately the responsibility of the Carnival Committee. An IRB water safety roster (Appendix B) is attached. Clubs not fulfilling their requirements will be withdrawn from the all events until they meet their obligations.

A Junior water safety roster (Appendix B) is also attached. Clubs not fulfilling their requirements will be withdrawn from the all events until they meet their obligations.

First Aid for the Championships is ultimately the responsibility of the Carnival Committee. A first aid roster (Appendix B) is attached. Clubs not fulfilling their requirements will be withdrawn from the all events until they meet their obligations.

D3 OVERSEAS / INTERSTATE COMPETITORS

Competitors from overseas / interstate Clubs, providing these are affiliated with International Life Saving (ILS) are permitted to participate in the 2010 WA Junior Surf Lifesaving Championships, however international or interstate competitors are not eligible for points or medals.

If these competitors finish in a medal or point scoring position, the next placed "local" competitor will be awarded the medal and points for that event.

D4 PROTESTS

All protests shall be lodged with the appropriate carnival official in accordance with the procedures set down in the 33rd Edition SLSA Surf Sports Manual, and shall identify the specific sections/clauses in the Competition Manual upon which the protest is based.

All protests must be submitted on the correct form. A copy of the form can be found in the back of the Surf Sports Manual.

A fee of \$220.00 will be charged to lodge a protest or appeal with the Appeals Committee. Should the protest or appeal be successful the fee will be refunded.

APPEALS COMMITTEE

This committee will be confirmed.

D5 TEAM ENTRIES AND CHANGES

Teams will have qualified as per the process outlined in section A2. Teams will qualify as a club and Team members may change.

D6 PRESENTATION OF MEDALLIONS / TROPHIES

Championship medallions in gold, silver and bronze will be awarded to the first three (3) individual/team place getters in each event.

Medals will be presented on the presentation dais at the conclusion of each event. It is imperative that once competitors are notified of their top three place they should go immediately to the presentation area. If you are required to be in another arena for an event, ensure the Sectional Referee is notified of your presentation commitments so the event can be postponed, whilst you are being presented with your medal.

COMPETITORS NOTE: Your stand-in must remain until you return to the competition arena

Competitors will not be permitted to receive their medal unless appropriately dressed. Competitors must present themselves with Club Competition Cap and costumes only, however Club and sponsor t-shirts and rash vests are permitted for sun protection.

A full copy of the State Championship results will be available on the web, www.mybeach.com.au, on the Monday following the event.

D7 MISCONDUCT

Misconduct before, during and after the Championships, including tampering with signs, fences or PA System equipment will not be tolerated. Offending members risk disciplinary action.

Consumption of alcohol is only permitted in the designated areas, however it is not permitted within the competition or marshalling areas. Competitors and club supporters drinking in these areas will render their club liable to disqualification and further disciplinary action.

A Carnival Disciplinary Committee has been appointed with powers to "cite" or take whatever action necessary as a result of misconduct.

D8 THEFT

Any person/s found stealing signage or any equipment owned by Surf Lifesaving WA or associated sponsors will be immediately reported to the Scarborough Police and that person/s will be brought before the SLSWA Judiciary Committee.

NOTE: Automatic disqualification from all Championship events will occur if any member is found guilty of theft.

D9 BEACH LAYOUT & ACCESS

Every effort will be made at these Championships to provide for a fair arena for all competitors and teams. If conditions are deemed unfair the Carnival Committee may relocate the arena. The Championships beach layout will be posted on www.mybeach.com.au from Tuesday 1st March 2010.

ACCESS TO BEACH

No unauthorized vehicles will be permitted on Trigg Island beach.

ACCESS TO COMPETITION ARENA

The only people permitted in the competition arena are:

- (a) Active Competition Officials
- (b) Active competitors (those in the marshalling area or in events)
- (c) Competitor stand-ins (these people must be wearing the competitors club cap in the marshalling area and competition arena for identification)

The Referee or Sectional Referee has the right to evict any person/s from the arena if the above access requirements are breached. Any person/s who breaches the above access requirement may be subject to disciplinary action.

D10 PARKING

A Site map indicating available parking will be released by the 1st March 2010 on www.mybeach.com.au

D11 GEAR TRAILERS AND CRAFT STORAGE

Gear Trailers are not permitted on the beach. Storage areas will be indicated on the Site map.

Note: No responsibility will be taken for craft left unattended.

D12 SECURITY

There will be limited security on Friday, Saturday night. No responsibility will be taken for damaged gear left unattended.

D13 CLUB TENTS AND SPECTATOR VIEWING

Clubs Tents are to be erected in the designated tent area behind the beach arena (please refer to the site map). There is no draw for tent positions. Clubs can have as many tents as they require.

Club Tents can be placed and erected at any time after 4.00pm on Friday 5th March 2008.

VIP viewing will be clearly marked and have restricted entry.

At no time are any person/s permitted to use the sand dunes as a viewing area. This is an environmentally protected area.

All spectators and competitors are also requested to utilise all rubbish bins made available, to ensure the beach remains tidy at all times and is left in pristine conditions.

D14 SCRUTINEERING

Officials reserve the right to scrutineer any craft.

D15 MARSHALLING

There will be marshalling calls over the central PA system. Marshalling times are detailed on the final program and will not be varied. Competitors are required to be in the vicinity of each separate marshalling area as relevant when the call for starters is made by the marshal.

D16 EVENT TIME LIMITS

All water events will be subject to a time limit.

In board relay, cameron relay and board rescue events, where the winning team is across the finish line, any other teams with members yet to enter the water may be withdrawn from the event.

In board rescue heats, once the first 3 place getters have been confirmed, any teams still on the water may be directed to paddle to the side of the course and return to the beach.

In iron person races, once the winner is across the finish line then any other competitor yet to enter the water for the final leg may be withdrawn from the event.

In surf races, a time limit will be announced on the day and any competitor exceeding that limit may be picked up by the duty boat and withdrawn from the event.

D17 JEWELLERY

The removal of all jewellery and other body adornments will be in accordance with the rules. The arena referee will have absolute authority in ruling on this.

D18 ADMINISTRATION CENTRE

The administration area will be located in the Trigg Island SLSC.

D20 CLUB MARSHAL'S BRIEFING

A compulsory meeting of all Club Marshall's will be held on Tuesday 2nd March 2010 at **Trigg SLSC** at 6.00pm.

D21 COMPETITION OFFICIALS BRIEFING

A Competition Officials Briefing will be held on Tuesday 2nd March 2010 at **Trigg SLSC** at 7.00pm. This is to confirm Officials' appointments and final program details.

Note: Country competition officials are not required to attend the Monday evening briefing due to travel constraints. Country competition officials will be fully briefed at the Saturday morning competition briefing.

PART E: COMMERCIAL AND OTHER IDENTIFICATION ON "APPAREL AND EQUIPMENT"

The Chief Executive Officer or his representative, Chief Referee and Sectional Referees, reserve the right to enforce the following from the SLSA Sponsorship Policy at the 2010 WA Junior Surf Lifesaving Championships.

- (a) No competitor shall be required to carry either the carnival naming rights or individual event sponsors identification on lycras, except where specified below (Note 1). Competitors will be required to carry sponsors logos / identification on craft/boats/ equipment and body (tattoos) except where specified below (Note 2). Where physically possible, no signage will be covered.

NOTE 1: All competitors in Championship events may be asked to wear naming right sponsor's lycra's.

NOTE II: Those craft/persons with rival sponsors to the carnival/event naming right sponsor will not be required to display the carnival/event naming right sponsors signage and/or to cover the rival sponsor's signage.

(b) CRAFT & EQUIPMENT
BOARDS

The front deck of boards will be the event sponsors signage area where a 33cm X 33cm (approx.) decal, etc, may be placed and the remainder of the surface area will be the owners.

If the designated spaces are not available or practical due to existing signage, then the naming rights/event sponsors signage will be placed on any suitable alternative spaces.

(c) UNIFORMS
LYCRA SINGLETS / FULL COSTUMES

A club can display its own sponsors signage, once only, in a space not exceeding 15cm X 15cm.

FULL COSTUMES

In this context, means women's costumes or R&R and March Past costumes. Again a club sponsor may be displayed once only in an area not exceeding 15cm X 15cm.

MALE COSTUMES

Club sponsors can be shown once only on an area on the costumes not exceeding 15cm X 5cm.

(d) MARCH PAST BANNERS

Club sponsors can be shown once only on the banner in an area not exceeding 25cm X 25cm.

(e) BODY TATTOOS

Club sponsors can be shown once only on the body and limbs not exceeding 15cm X 5cm.

Water Safety & First Aid Roster

Saturday 6th & Sunday 7th March

Water Safety at the 2010 WA Junior State Championships is based upon a minimum of two rescue boards, and two rescue tubes for each of the four water arenas, plus four IRB's.

All rostered water safety personnel are requested to report to the **Carnival Water Safety Coordinator**. A 15 minute overlap in the periods is to allow briefing of new water safety personnel prior to replacing the previous group.

Clubs are requested to provide rescue boards, rescue tubes as well as water safety caps/vests for their clubs rostered period.

Equipped IRB's will be available for the rostered IRB crews.

The roster is based upon entry numbers from each club. The water safety roster is the same for both days.
